

# How to use the UN SP on FOE: a practical guide

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#### **Individual Petition**

- Direct Intervention by mandate holder
- Violations that have already occurred, ongoing of which have a high risk of occurring
- Sending a letter to the Government requesting information, comment, preventative or investigatory action
- Can concern individual cases, trends, patterns of violations



#### 2 Kinds of Communications

#### **Letter of allegation**

Letter to Government requesting formation and response to allegations

#### **Urgent action**

Asking Government to take preventative or investigatory action



### **Admissibility Criteria**

- Intervention is at the discretion of the Mandate holder
- · Not abusive language, politically motivated
- Credible Information:
  - Internal consistency of information
  - Precision of factual details
  - Within scope of mandate
  - Not based solely on media reports
  - Supporting evidence where possible
  - Fill in questionnaire where required LA, not always for UA



## **Submitting the Complaint: What information is needed?**

- <u>Identity of alleged victim</u> name, age, gender, profession, ethnicity, affiliations
- <u>Nature of medium affected</u> newspapers, radio, art, incl. Circulation, frequency of broadcast, publication, public performance
- <u>Identification of alleged perpetrators</u> State, non state actors, State tolerance, inaction,threats
- Identification of organisation/person submitting complaint (kept confidential) — name, fax no, telephone, number, address
- Who, what, where, when, how and why



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### Consider the following:

- Has there been a violation? More than one?
- Does it fall within the Mandate?
- How much information do you need? More
- Consent of family member?
- Managing client's expectations
- What do you want Spec Rapporteur to do?
- Pass on updating information
- English/French/Spanish
